## Renamo wins in Beira and Chimoio

Renamo and its leader, Afonso Dhlakama, have won the 15 October general elections in the central Mozambican cities of Beira and Chimoio, according to the results published by the city elections commissions.

The results were as follows:

### Beira

Presidential election

Valid votes - 141,052

Afonso Dhlakama (Renamo)	69,607	(49.4%)
Filipe Nyusi (Frelimo)	47,317	(35.5%)
Daviz Simango (MDM)	24,128	(17%)

Parliamentary election

Renamo	50,521	(37.59%)
Frelimo	43,247	(32.17%)
MDM	38,932	(28.96%)

AIM's sources, the daily papers "Mediafax" and "Noticias", did not give a total of valid votes cast in the parliamentary election. The percentages do not add up to 100 because the couple of dozen minor parties on the ballot paper, who took 1.3 per cent of the vote between them have been disregarded.

### Chimoio

Presidential election

Valid votes – 76,670

Afonso Dhlakama (Renamo)	38,067	(49.65%)
Filipe Nyusi (Frelimo)	33,686	(43.94%)
Daviz Simango (MDM)	4,917	(6.41%)

Parliamentary election

Valid votes – 75,738

Renamo	34,604	(45.69%)
Frelimo	32,652	(43.12%)
MDM	7,229	(9.54%)

Turnout in Beira was 53.6%, and in Chimoio it was 51.3%.
